Score is left to give emotional weight to each scene, and they all sound like something you bubbeh or zayde would dance to. The music is composed by Oscar-winner Michael Giacchino, best known for his work with Pixar (the Up theme that makes you cry? That's his), Marvel, and Star Trek movies, and the Israeli composer Nami Melumad. It's certainly considered contemporary in terms of how it makes the movie feel, but at the same time feels like it came straight from the so-called old country. And if you know anything about the way Giacchino titles his songs, they are always punny and sometimes so on the nose it hurts. He was up to his usual antics with An American Pickle, because his same song naming tradition remains, but this time with a Yiddish twist. Yiddish is widely used in the film, as Rogen launches into full monologues in the language. Although his dialogue is not subtitled for us to understand, the Yiddish titles Giacchino and Melumad use are at least a little more commonplace. When Rogen's Herschel and Ben Greenbaum get into a fight with a bunch of Cossacks, the music played during the scene is, Klezmer Fight Club. Later, when Herschel has to go and find Ben, that song is aptly titled, Schleppling to Schlupsk - when was the last time you schlepped somewhere? The soundtrack also has some pickle puns, because of course it does. An aptly named song is Pickle Your Fancy, and hopefully you understand that game on words. The end issue of the film is The Silver Brining, which certainly sounds like the silver lining, but brining is actually a pounding term, meaning there's something to soak in salt water. And let's not forget the credits song, Pickles, Suite of Sour, given that pickles can be sweet, or sour, and also suite is a common musical melody. These are so smart it hurts. If Yiddish and pickles aren't your thing, there are also two perfectly placed Star Wars jokes on the soundtrack. Giacchino composed the music for Rogue One: A Star Wars Story, but here the homage is paid to the original trilogy with back-to-back songs, Regene of the Ben and The Pickle Empire Strikes Back. Checking out the American Pickle soundtrack might not be the first thing you do after you've finished the movie, but like Herschel, take a few seconds to appreciate the beauty and wonder of the world, and also pickle puns. MusiXploitation is a series of posters for films that exist only in the hearts of rabid fans. In the late 90s, Master P would release full-length narrative films with the same titles as his albums, which were kind of fictional precursors to Lemonade with some seriously fraught dialogue. This new series is a look at the world where that practice struck with the entire music industry. Created by Paris-based art director David Redon, the series features blaxploitation-style posters for songs and albums by Amy Winehouse, 2Pac and Jay-Z. (Previously, Redon had stomped musicians with vintage ads.) Some are thematically appropriate, such as Frank Ocean's galactic, ghostly Pyramids, and others would no doubt make their namesakes so very upset, as The Miseducation of Lauryn Hill transformed into a bikini bank heist barber. Like the recent Quentin Tarantino book covers featured on Co.Create, some of the entries have been marred by almost comically bad photoshop.
